The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met at 9:03 a.m. on Tuesday, August 16, 2022, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building, Rapid City, South Dakota. Vice-Chair Lloyd LaCroix called the meeting to order with the following Commissioners present: Deb Hadcock and Travis Lasseter. Commissioner Ron Rossknecht joined by teleconference.

5. **APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 2, 2022, REGULAR MEETING:** MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Lasseter to approve the minutes of the minutes of the August 2, 2022, regular meeting. Vote: Unanimous.

2022 CENTRAL STATES FAIR KICKOFF PROCLAMATION: MOVED by Lasseter and seconded by Hadcock to approve the Executive Proclamation to be read at the Kickoff of the 77th Annual Central States Fair. Vote: Unanimous.

9:00 A.M. PUBLIC HEARING: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Lasseter to approve the resolution granting authority to the West River Lyman-Jones Rural Water Systems for County Wide Permission to install Rural Water Pipelines. Vote: Unanimous.

RESOLUTION

The Board having held a hearing on the application of West River / Lyman-Jones Water Rural Water Systems, Inc., for authority to construct or lay a water pipeline over, across or under public highways, except state trunk system highways, in Pennington County for the purpose of providing rural water service; and

WHEREAS, West River / Lyman-Jones Water Rural Water Systems, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under and by the laws of the State of South Dakota, qualified and authorized to operate and transact business in the State of South Dakota, has filed application in the form required by law with the Auditor of Pennington County, South Dakota, for authority to construct or lay a water pipeline over, across or under public highways, except state trunk system highways, in Pennington County for the purpose of providing rural water service, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of said Pennington County have examined said application and found:

1. That said application is in the form and contains the information required by law.
2. That said application was filed with the County Auditor of Pennington County, and all persons, firms, or corporation owning or operating transmission, telegraph and telephone lines, and pipeline, within Pennington County were notified by registered or certified mail at least (10)

days prior to the Board's hearing on said application, and that said notice stated the time and place, when and where such application should be heard.

3. That the Board has considered the complaints of all parties appearing, and has adjusted all differences between applicant and the owner or owners of any transmission, telegraph or telephone lines affected by the Board's decision upon said application.

4. That the operation, maintenance and construction (if and when found necessary by the applicant) of said pipelines will be to the public interest, and that said permit should be granted, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth:

THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Pennington County, South Dakota, that West River / Lyman-Jones Water Rural Water Systems, Inc., a corporation, organized and existing under and authorized to operate and transact business in the State of South Dakota, its successors and assigns, hereinafter called the grantee, by and hereby are authorized and granted a right-of-way permit to construct, operate, and maintain same as and whenever necessary, rural water pipelines on, along, and under public highways in Pennington County, South Dakota, except state trunk highways. That this permit is granted pursuant to SDCL 31-26-25, authorizing a general grant as to all public highways for rural water purposes and it is found and resolved hereby that the grantee, West River / Lyman-Jones Water Rural Water Systems, Inc., is operating its entire system primarily and principally for rural water purposes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this permit is subject to the following conditions, and such other reasonable regulations as the Legislature may hereinafter prescribe:

1. The grantee shall not in any way have the exclusive right to use such highway for the constructing of rural water pipelines and fixtures.

2. The pipelines and fixtures shall be so constructed as not to prevent the public use of any road or the navigation of any stream.

3. When any highway along such line has been constructed shall be changed, grantee shall upon ninety (90) days' notice in writing remove such pipeline to the highway as changed, unless an agreement shall be made to allow the same to remain pursuant to law.

4. The grantee shall construct and maintain said pipelines in accordance with all appropriate laws and regulations of the State of South Dakota.

5. This right-of-way permit shall be effective and in full force for a period of twenty (20) years from date hereof.

6. That the grantee shall notify the County in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to the construction of any additional pipelines along and on all public highways in Pennington County.

F. REQUEST TO NOT BUILD TO ORDINANCE 14 STANDARDS: Kevin Quinn. MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by LaCroix to approve the request to waive the requirements of Ordinance 14 to submit an engineered road construction plan, to construct a turnaround, 2 – foot-deep ditches, less than 6 inches of gravel and a road width of 24 feet. It is further moved the road will be constructed to 20’ feet wide with a 4-5-inch gravel base with four (4) conditions: 1) That any future development or access off of this portion of Section Line road or future development or access off of the extended portion of this Section Line Road obtain separate waivers; 2) That the ditches constructed are constructed to prevent water runoff from overtopping the road; 3) That the

applicant obtains a survey to show that the road is constructed within the Section Line; and, 4) That the applicant submit engineered drainage plans for the road. Vote: Unanimous.

PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT OVERLAY REVIEW / PU 22-06: Katie Smirnova and Brett Walfish. To review a Planned Unit Development Overlay to allow a single-family residence to be used as a summer/winter educational music camp, to allow off-season musical performance concerts each year, to allow shed/cabins to be used for classes and rehearsals, and a Bed and Breakfast on the subject property in accordance with Section 216 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lot C2, Brassfield Subdivision, Section 28, T1S, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Lasseter and seconded by Hadcock to approve the extension of PU 22-06, with an amendment to Condition #17 that the Bed and Breakfast is not operated until the road is improved and if the bed and breakfast is not to be operated, the applicants permanently stabilize the cut-outs along Klondike Road, with twenty-nine (29) conditions: 1) That the approved uses include: practice cabins to be used for daily practices, music rehearsals and music coaching, an educational music school/camp, a single-family residence to also be used as a Bed and Breakfast or lodging facility for music camp attendees and performance/showcase events for the Rushmore Music Festival Board of Directors; 2) That there be no more than 4 practice cabins; 3) That there be no more than one music camp per calendar year not to exceed 30 people including the residents; 4) That there be no more than one performance/showcase event per year with attendance limited to 50 individuals for the Rushmore Music Festival Board of Directors; 5) That the number of guests staying in the Bed and Breakfast is not to exceed 6 guests from a single family; 6) That at the time of sale or transfer of the property, the PUD would only transfer to the current applicant, their heirs, or the Rushmore Music Festival, with Rushmore Music Festival being the only organization allowed to use the property through the PUD. Otherwise, the PUD will automatically end; 7) That if the Rushmore Music Festival ceases the property's use and the PUD is ended, all temporary sheds (used for lessons & practicing) will be removed from the property prior to closing; 8) That the unit numbers be assigned to each individual rehearsal cabin, be posted on the cabin and inside the cabin; 9) That the address for the main house continue to be posted on the residence, so that it is visible from both directions of travel on Klondike Road, in accordance with Pennington County's Ordinance #20; 10) That the Bed and Breakfast meet § 323 (PCZO); 11) That the minimum number of required parking spaces be provided in accordance with Pennington County Zoning Ordinance (PCZO) §310 and that a parking plan is submitted to the Planning Department prior to operation of the music camp or Bed and Breakfast; 12) That the applicant maintains all necessary permits from other governing bodies for the operation of the Bed and Breakfast, including, but not limited to, approval from the South Dakota Department of Health and a Sales Tax License from the South Dakota Department of Revenue; 13) That the applicant maintains an Evacuation (Emergency) Plan and provide copies to all overnight guests in case there is a need to evacuate guests from the property in the event of an emergency and that a copy of said plan be provided to the Planning Department; 14) That the property remains free of debris and junk vehicles and all structures be well-maintained; 15) That all existing drainage ways be maintained and erosion control measures be implemented on all disturbed areas so as not to allow any sedimentation of existing drainage ways or bodies of water per PCZO § 507(A). This includes any requirements set forth in the Pennington County Stormwater Quality Manual for erosion and

sediment measures and that the existing turn outs and work be stabilized and replanted to prevent continued erosion, soil movement and damage to the surrounding property and the road; 16) That an approved Building Permit be obtained for any structure(s) exceeding 144 square feet or permanently anchored to the ground, which requires a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director; 17) That prior to the operation of the Bed and Breakfast or any increase in the number of music camps per year, will require Klondike Road to be improved to a minimum of 18-foot wide south/southeast of the bridge to the driveway of the single-family residence, and if the bed and breakfast is not to be operated, the applicants permanently stabilize the cut-outs along Klondike Road; 18) That all exterior lighting must be of low-level intensity, which does not result in excessive glare upon surrounding neighbors; 19) That a smoke detector be placed in each sleeping room, with a minimum of at least one (1) smoke detector per floor; 20) That portable fire extinguishers be placed on each floor level so they are accessible to all guests at all times and the fire extinguishers shall be inspected and tagged annually; 21) That quiet hours be between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.; 22) That daily operations be conducted by the owners, on-site manager, and staff of the Rushmore Music Festival or their heirs or subsidiaries; 23) That the applicants comply with South Dakota Codified Law 34-18; 24) That all on-site wastewater treatment systems (OSWTS) require proper permitting and review of the system by both the Pennington County Planning Department and South Dakota Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources and must comply with Pennington County Zoning Ordinance (PCZO) § 204-J and South Dakota Administrative Rules 74:53:01; 25) That setbacks for all structures shall be a minimum of 25 feet from exterior lot lines; 26) That there is legal access to the property for the requested uses; 27) That the Planning Director may allow additional development or construction, which is consistent with the existing development on this property. Any “significant change”, including but not limited to, the use or impacts on adjacent land or access road, the increase in the number of guests permitted to stay at the bed and breakfast, an increase in the number of attendees or the frequency of music camps or performances/showcases, the increase in the number of structures, and/or as required by PCZO §216, shall require an amendment to this Planned Unit Development Overlay; 28) That the Board of Commissioners are able to restrict the uses in this Planned Unit Development Overlay and that this Planned Unit Development Overlay is reviewed annually; and, 29) That this Planned Unit Development be reviewed in February 2023, on a complaint basis, or as deemed necessary by either the Planning Commission or Board of Commissioners to verify all Conditions of Approval are being met. Vote: The motion carried 3-1 with Rossknecht voting no.

MOVED by LaCroix and seconded by Hadcock to take a ten-minute recess. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Lasseter to discuss items H, I & J then vote on them each separately. Vote: Unanimous.

G. REOPEN OF SECTION LINE RIGHT-OF-WAY / RS 22-01: Crossed Sabres, LLP - Applicant. Darren Raines – Owner. Longbranch Civil Engineering, Inc. – Agent. To reopen a previously vacated Section Line Right-of-Way between Section 1 and Section 36, T2S, R4E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.
