NATIONAL CENTER FOR PUBLIC LANDS COUNTIES – 1% VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION: MOVED by Drewes and seconded by Rossknecht to approve Resolution 2023-C3 authorizing a contingency transfer for the contribution of \$21,896.78 to support the National Center for Public Lands Counties. **PENNINGTON COUNTY RESOLUTION 2023-C3
CONTINGENCY TRANSFER
GENERAL FUND CONTINGENCY BUDGET (101-0112)**

WHEREAS, through the FY2023 annual budget process, the Pennington County Board of Commissioners allocated \$100,000 to the General Fund Contingency Budget (101-0112); and

WHEREAS, the current balance of the General Fund Contingency Budget is \$70,000; and

WHEREAS, The National Association of Counties (NACo) and Western Interstate Region (WIR) Boards of Directors established the National Center for Public Lands Counties (The Center) to give public lands counties an enhanced opportunity to demonstrate how prosperous public lands counties create a prosperous America; and

WHEREAS, Pennington County, SD has 684,831 total acres of federally owned and operated land within its boundaries and receives Payments In Lieu of Taxes (PILT) payments from the federal government. These federal payments help offset losses in property taxes due to nontaxable federal lands within the County's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, The Center will identify and complete research projects, collect and create data and information, and at times provide detailed, individual research and written county profiles focused on the benefit, opportunities, and impact of Public Lands in our counties; and

WHEREAS, research work conducted by The Center will be non-partisan, aligned with NACo policy and priorities and will not directly conflict with the interests of any county; and

WHEREAS, The Center will be developing detailed county profiles, emphasizing the importance of recreation and tourism and being able to engage with the federal government on how important these PILT payments are to the counties who have federal lands in them; and

WHEREAS, for The Center to meet its mission and serve as a long-term tool for public lands counties, a one-time voluntary investment of \$15 million from counties throughout the nation is being sought over the next two years. These resources will provide the necessary ongoing funding for staff and consultants to plan, initiate, and complete critical research, projects, activities, communication materials and an annual work plan and place The Center on a sustainable future financial course; and

WHEREAS, the investment amount is calculated based on one percent of the allocation of the Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Funds (LATCF); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Pennington County Auditor is authorized to transfer \$21,896.78 from the 2023 General Fund Contingency Budget (101-0112) to the General Fund Commission Office Budget Grants to Other Entities (101-0111-0454) and make payment to the South Dakota Association of County Commissioners who will remit payment to NACo on behalf of the South Dakota Counties who choose to invest in The Center.
